## **General Information**



#### Introduction

SSCI laminated Exam Tables, Treatment Tables, and Prep-Procedure Tables can be fitted with laminated tops in place of stainless steel tops. Laminated tops feature rounded corners and are finished with high-pressure laminate to the top surface and edges. You can select the top's laminate color to coordinate with your facility's decor; refer to your SSCI catalog for colors and ordering information.

The particleboard substrate used by SSCI for its laminates is the ideal solution for interior applications where high humidity and intermittent water contact are common, and is far more resistant to moisture and water exposure than conventional industrial particleboard. The particleboard used on SSCI's products is manufactured with highly compressed wood fibers and a specially formulated resin to produce a substrate with superior strength, rigidity, and an extra-hard surface. Screw holding strength is substantially greater than typical industrial particleboard, while swelling caused by water soaking is much less.

These instructions guide you in installing these laminated tops to your laminated SSCI table. The information here is applicable to both island style tables and abutted style.

### Installation Procedures

	Un-packing and Inspection	<b>CAUTION:</b> Unpacking and installing the table top is not difficult. The top is heavy, however, and handling it can be awkward for one person. We recommend that unpacking and installation be done by at least two people.			
		Contact the shipping company immediately if the shipping appears damaged in any way. Save all damaged packing to assist in proving liability for damage.

# Exam Tables and Treatment Tables

Overview	This section covers the installation of laminated tops to SSCI Exam
	Tables and Treatment Tables. These tables are similar in structure
	and do not have tubs. Treatment Tables can be full-cabinet style or
	recessed-end, and island type or abutted. For Prep-Procedure
	Tables (which have tubs) refer to Page 8. Note: These instructions
	do NOT apply to exam tables with scale tops; refer to the Owner's
	Manual provided with the scale.

You will need the following tools to perform this installation:

#### **Tools Required**

- Phillips screwdriver
- Electric drill
- 1/16-in. bit for drill
- Tape measure or ruler

**Procedure** *CAUTION:* Installing the table top is not difficult. The top is heavy, however, and handling it can be awkward for one person. We recommend that installation be done by at least two people.




Figure 1. "Figure 8" Fitting - Original Orientation

- 1. Notice the two "Figure 8" fittings on the upper edges of the cabinet sides (Figures 1 and 3).




Figure 2. "Figure 8" Fitting - Final Orientation

- 2. Loosen the mounting screws and turn the fittings so that the small ends of the fittings project outward (Figure 2). Tighten the screws.
- 3. Remove any staples or cardboard scraps from the underside of the top so that the underside is totally smooth.




Figure 3. Mounting Locations for the Laminated Top

4. Examine the upper surface of the cabinet (top is not yet installed) and locate the six small drilled holes (Figure 3). You will need to know the locations of these holes in *Step 9*.

- 5. Place the top on the cabinet and center it, as close as possible front-to-rear and leftto-right (Figure 4). Make sure the top overhangs the table equally on both sides, and on both ends. Check the overhangs with a tape measure or ruler to get them as equal as possible. **Note:** On abutted tables, the end of the top with the square corners should fit flush with the end of the table.
- 6. Drill two 1/16-in. dia. holes in the underside of the top through the vacant holes in the "Figure 8" fittings. **Note:** Drill the holes no more than 1-in. deep to prevent them from coming out the upper surface of the top.
- 7. With two screws (supplied) fasten the top to the fittings.
- 8. Open the doors and/or remove the drawers (depending on table configuration) to access the interior of the cabinet.
- 9. With six screws (supplied), fasten the top to the cabinet through the six small drilled holes you located in *Step 4*.

### Prep-Procedure Tables

Overview	This section covers the installation of laminated tops and stainless steel tubs to SSCI Prep-Procedure Tables. These procedures are the same for full-cabinet style or recessed-end or middle style, and island type or abutted. For Exam Tables and Treatment Tables (which do not have tubs) refer to <i>Page 6</i> .		
Tools and Supplies Required	You w installa	rill need the following tools and supplies to perform this ation: Phillips screwdriver Electric drill 1/16-in. bit for drill Tape measure or ruler Caulking gun Waterproof silicon caulk	
Procedure	<b>CAUTION:</b> Installing the table top and tub is not difficult. The top and tub are heavy, however, and handling them can be awkward for one person. We recommend that installation be done by at least two people.		
	1.	Notice the four "Figure 8" fittings on the upper edges of the cabinet sides (Figure 1).	
	2.	Loosen the mounting screws and turn the fittings so that the small ends of the fittings project outward (Figure 2). Tighten the screws.	
	3.	Remove any staples or cardboard scraps from the underside of the top so that the underside is totally smooth.




Figure 5. Prep-Procedure Table Top Showing Center Section to be Cut Out for Tub

	4.	The top is shipped as a single, solid piece to minimize damage during shipment. The tub location is shown by partial cuts in the top (Figure 5). The center piece must be cut out of the top to install the tub. We recommend you secure the services of a professional carpenter to finish the cuts to insure accuracy and to reduce the possibility of accidental damage.

- 5. Place the top on the cabinet and center it, as close as possible, front-to-rear and left-to-right (Figure 4). Make sure the top overhangs the table equally on both sides, and on both ends. Check the overhangs with a tape measure or ruler to get them as equal as possible. **Note:** On abutted tables, the end of the top with the square corners should fit flush with the end of the table.
- 6. Drill four 1/16-in. dia. holes through the vacant holes in the "Figure 8" fittings and into the underside of the top.
  Note: Drill the holes no deeper than 1-in. to prevent them from coming out the upper surface of the top.
- 7. With the screws supplied, fasten the top to the fittings.




Figure 6. Prep-Procedure Table Ready to Receive Tub

- 8. Place the tub into the open center section of the top. **Note:** The faucet holes should be at the same end of the table as the faucet/drain well (Figure 6).




Figure 7. Prep-Procedure Table With Tub Installed

- 9. With a caulking gun and waterproof silicon sealant, seal completely around the junction between the tub and the laminated top (Figure 7).
- 10. Complete all the necessary plumbing for the drain, faucet, and sprayer and connect these items.
